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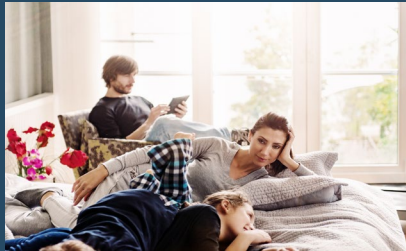

What is ACF?

As an operating division within HHS, the Administration for Children & Families (ACF) promotes the economic and social well-being of families, children, youth, individuals and communities through funding, strategic partnerships, guidance, training and technical assistance.



Scope of Operations:

- ~\$70B in annual grant funding
- 60+ programs spanning human services, economic support, and child welfare
- 12,000+ grants and cooperative agreements awarded annually
- 3,300+ recipients including states, nonprofits, and tribal governments

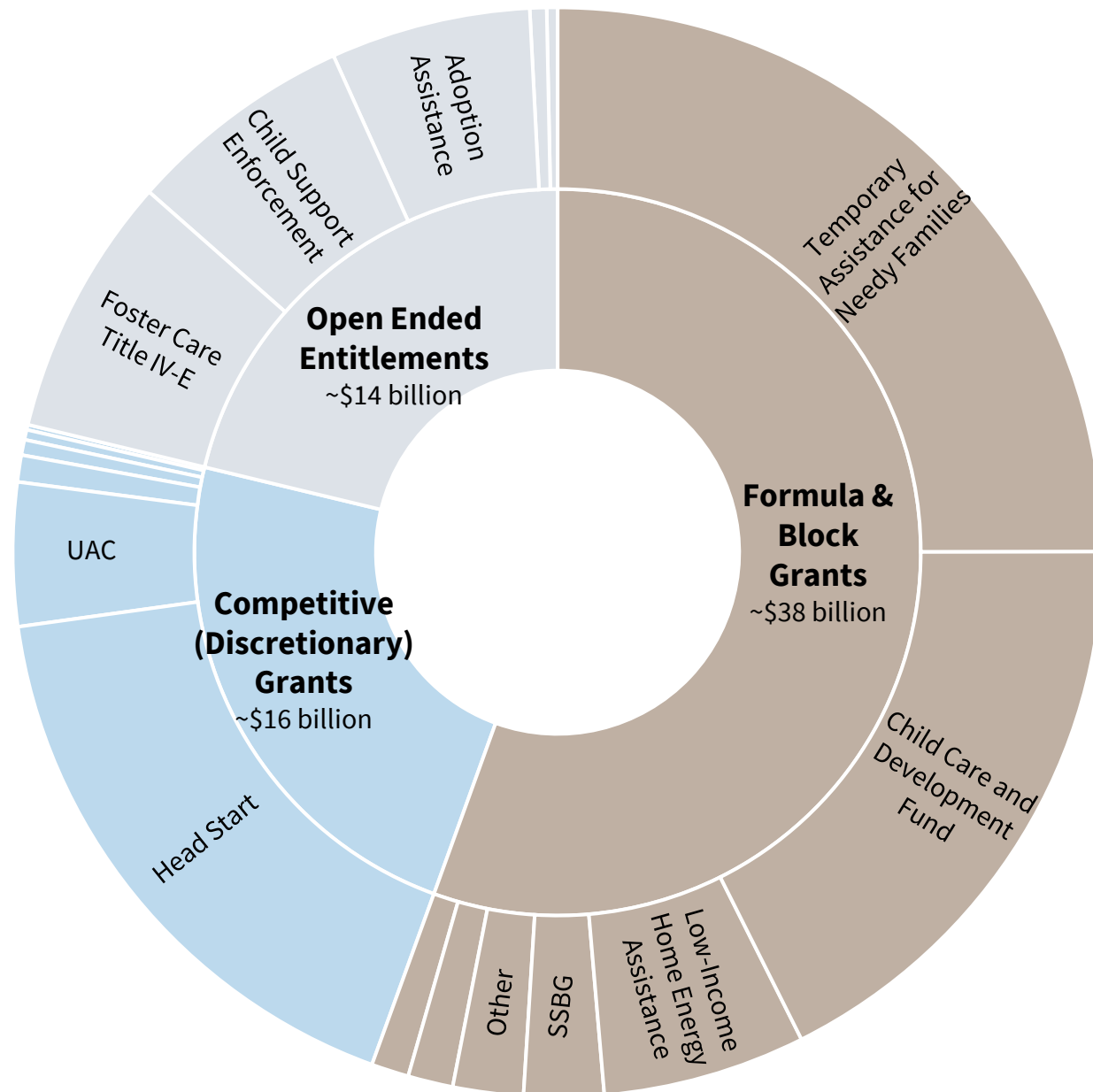
Office of Grants Management (OGM):

- Centralized issuance and fiscal oversight across all programs
- Serves as the operational control point ensuring timely, compliant, and accountable grant execution at scale

ACF awarded over \$68 billion in grants in FY 2025

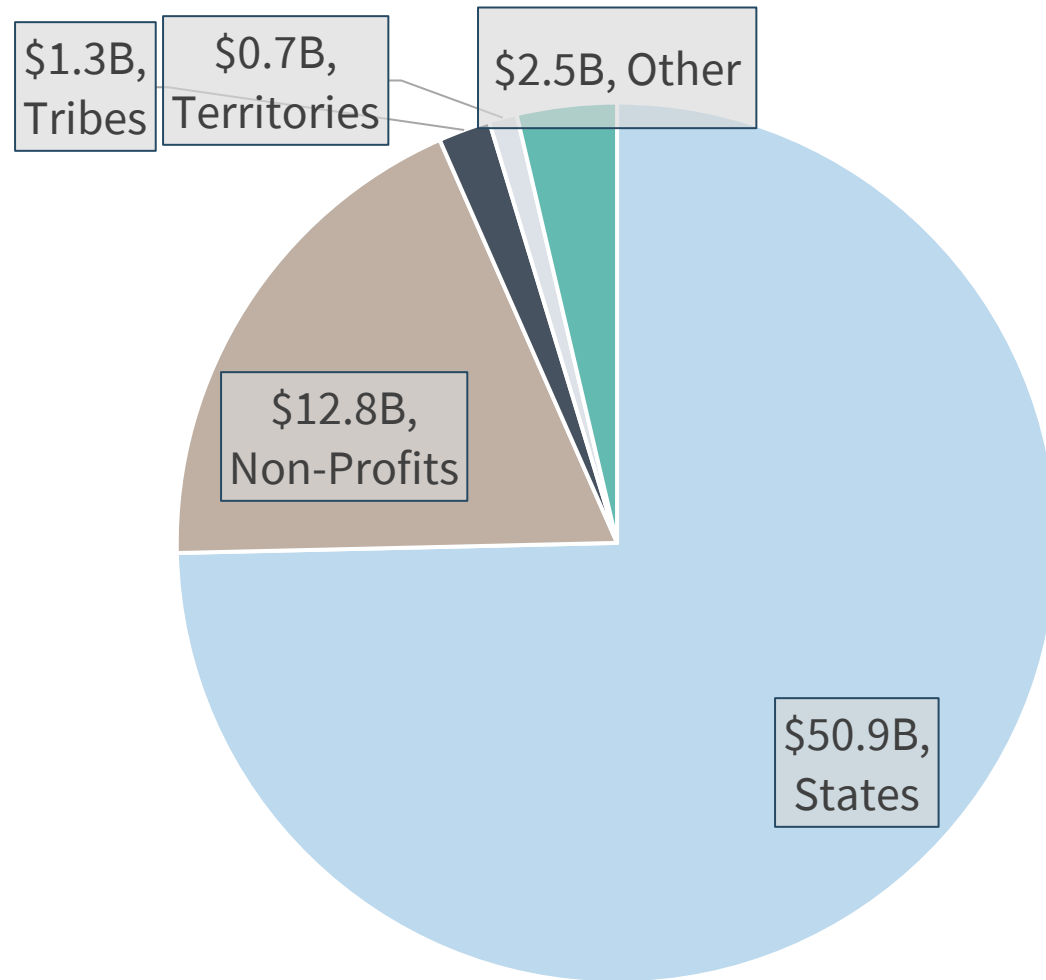
The **12,000+** grants and cooperative agreements ACF awards annually to **3,300+** recipients includes approximately:

- \$51 billion to states
- \$13 billion to non-profits
- \$1 billion to tribal governments

The Reality

Managing data in a grants environment can be challenging

Most fed/state/local agencies face one or more of the following with data:

- Data exists but isn't usable – Fragmented across systems
- Siloed systems – Hard to access and synthesize
- Reactive vs. proactive management – Limited real time visibility into grant performance
- Compliance-driven mindset – Data collected is used more for reporting than for actually managing programs

What Good Looks Like

How do you move from data for reporting to data for decision making?

Data as a management tool:

- Real time visibility into grant performance
- Data aligned to decisions, not just reporting requirements
- Shared access across grants staff
- Ability to identify risk early and intervene proactively
- Standardized, trusted data that drives accountability and strengthens internal controls

Ideal State

We don't want the data itself, we believe it is a tool that can be used to optimize outcomes at scale

Data that is accurate, comprehensive, and current helps serve as a foundation for more ambitious use cases:

- From relying on retrospective reporting to real time program insights and intelligence
- From compliance metrics to outcome and impact measurement
- From static risk scoring to adaptive oversight that focuses attention where it matters
- From opaque internal processes to full public transparency

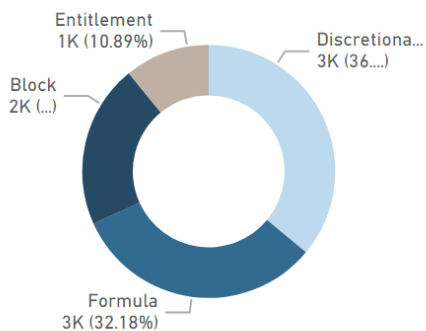

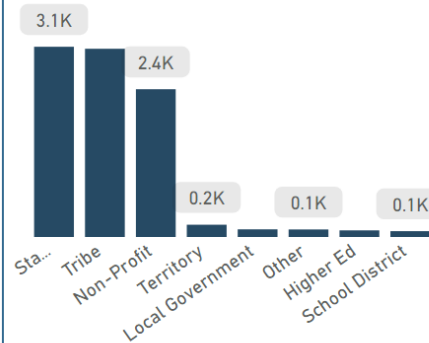

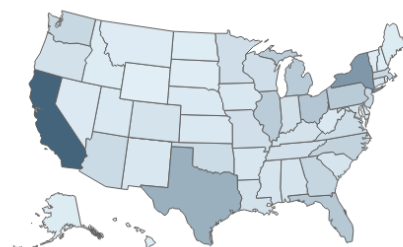
Award Actions by Program Type



Actions by Recipient Type

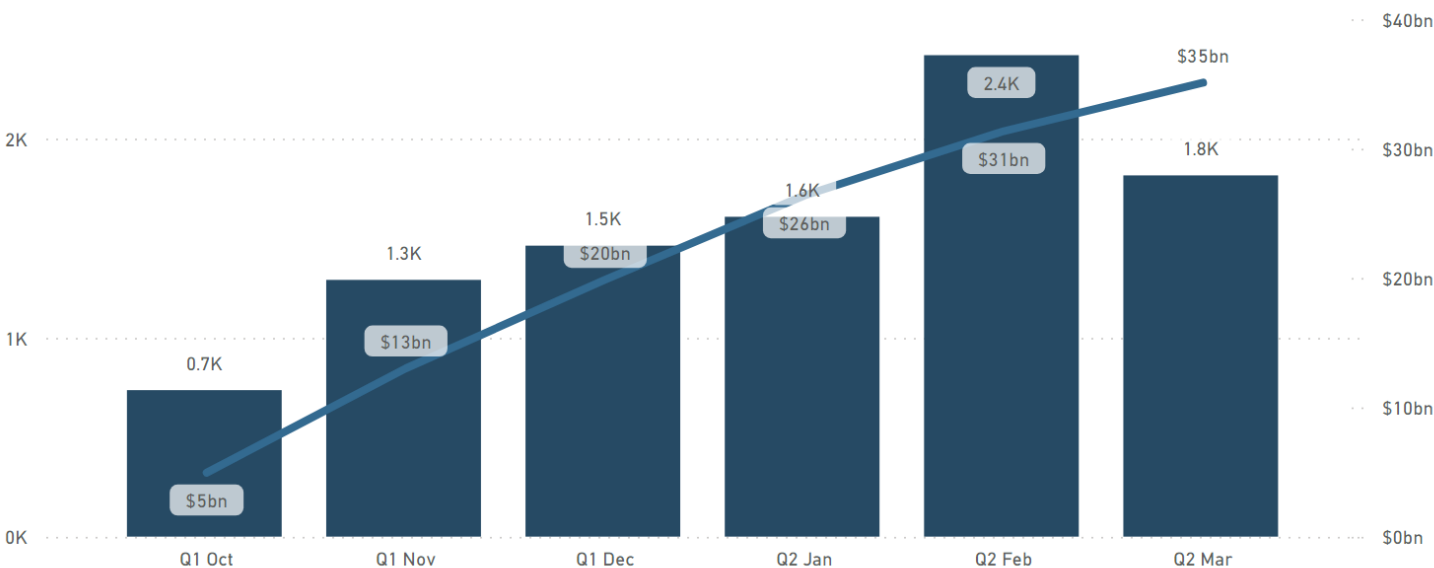

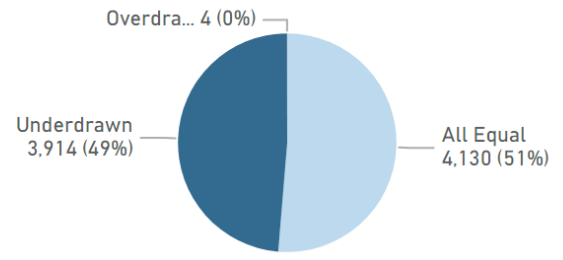

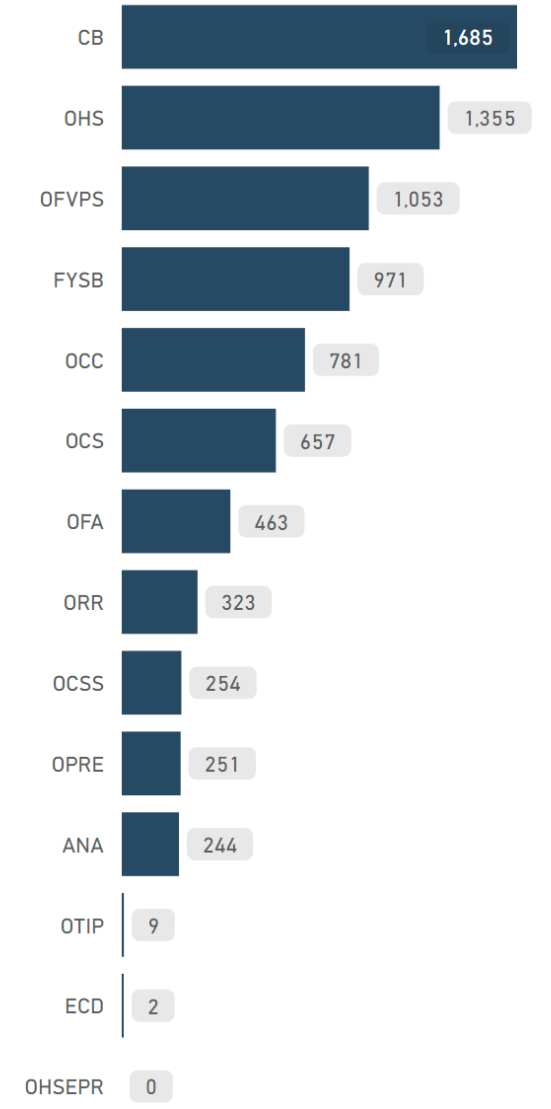

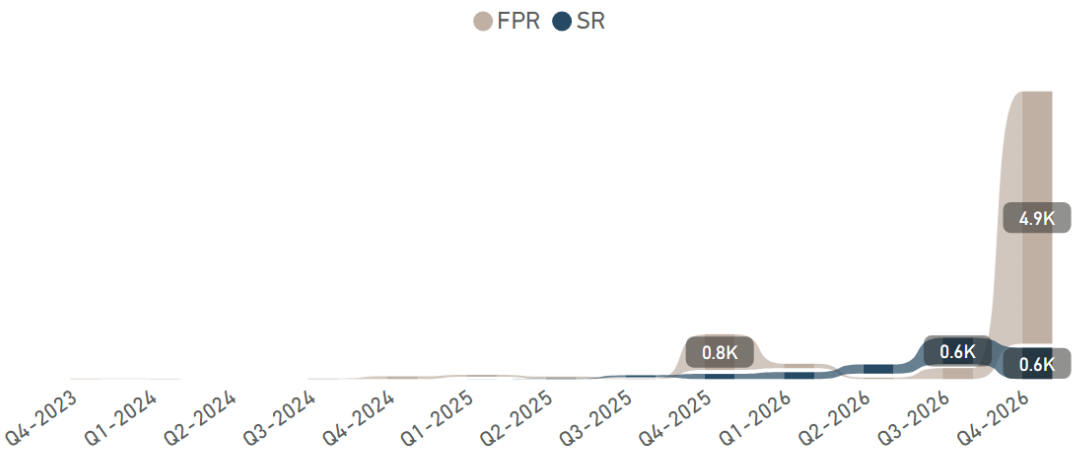

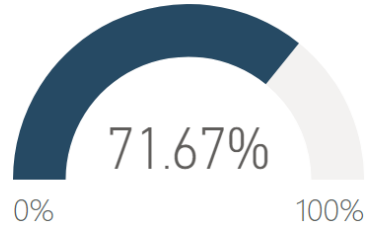

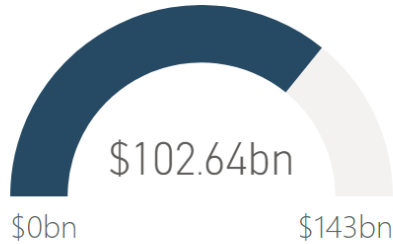

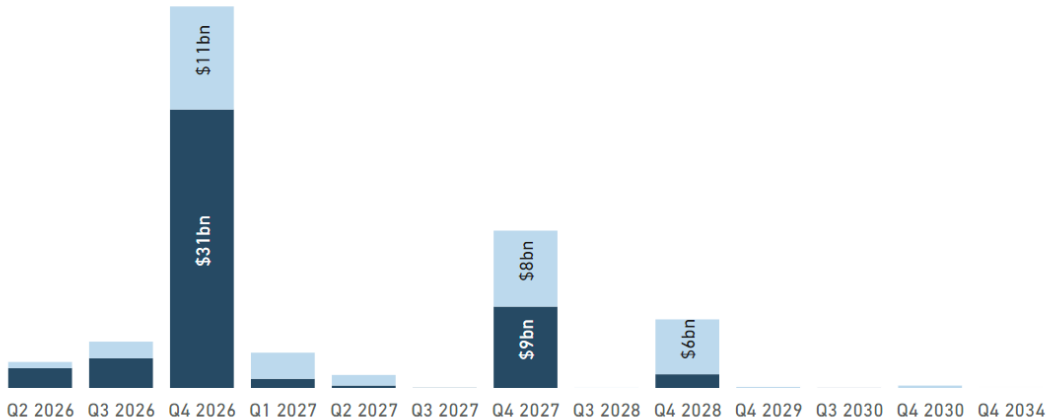
